IN-YEAR ADMISSIONS

An in-year admission is the process whereby you apply for a place at a school if your child is already attending school and you wish to move them to another school.

Mid-Year Entry

At present we only have places available in Year 8 and Year 9. For Year 7 and KS4 we are operating waiting lists.

If you live in Kent or are about to move into Kent and want a place for your child at our school, you must complete an In Year Admissions Form (IYAF) and return all 3 pages to the Admissions Officer at the School. This form is available to download on our website or a paper copy can be obtained from the school office. Parents or guardians should complete the application form and fill in a separate form for each child and school to which you apply.

If you have a new address, please attach evidence that you and the child reside at this address. If you have not yet moved, we will process the application when we receive evidence to show that the move is taking place (for example; an exchange of contracts or a rental agreement on a property in Kent).

We are a grammar school and as such any student applying for a place must have been assessed as suitable for a grammar school place through either the Kent County Council's 11+ assessment procedure (Kent Test) or Borden entrance exam. Where the applicant has not taken the Kent Test, the school will arrange for an internal assessment to take place. Being assessed as suitable for a place at this school does not in itself guarantee a place and in the event of the year group being over-subscribed, a waiting list will be held and ranked according to the over-subscription criteria, please see our Admissions Policy. Waiting Lists will only be held for the academic year applied and will be re-ranked in line with the oversubscription criteria every time a student is added.

Admission into Year 10

In most circumstances boys would not benefit from joining the school in Year 10. This is because Borden students start their GCSE syllabuses in Year 9 and boys joining after that time would be significantly disadvantaged and required to spend a lot of time on private study to be working at the same level of their peers.

Appeals

Parents have a statutory right of appeal, should an application be refused. Please write to: The Clerk to the Appeal Panel, Borden Grammar School, Avenue of Remembrance, Sittingbourne, Kent ME10 DB. Appeals should take the form of a letter briefly setting out the grounds for the appeal. The Clerk will acknowledge receipt and will initiate arrangements for the hearing of the appeal by an Independent Appeal Panel.
